

TRANSLATION OF TIME CRYSTALS CONFERENCE REGULATIONS

September 6-8, 2023

("Regulations")

§ 1

Date and duration

1. These Regulations specify the rights and obligations of the Participants of the Time Crystals Conference (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference"), which will take place from September 6 to 8, 2023, in-person in Krakow, at the Manggha Museum, located at 26 Konopnickiej Street.
2. The Organizer of the Conference is the Jagiellonian University, located at 24 Gołębia Street, 31-007 Krakow, Faculty of Physics, Astronomy, and Applied Computer Science (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer").
3. A Participant of the Conference is any adult natural person with full legal capacity, who no later than May 31, 2023, has expressed a desire to participate in the Conference in the manner specified in § 2 of the Regulations, has accepted the rules of participation in the Conference specified in the Regulations, has been qualified by the Scientific Committee for participation in the Conference, and has paid the conference fee no later than July 31, 2023 (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant").
4. The Regulations are made available to Participants on the Conference website time-crystals.org (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference Website"), in both the Polish and English languages, in a manner that enables them to be downloaded.
5. The Organizer reserves the right to amend the Regulations due to changes in universally binding laws and the need to adjust the Regulations to such changes, in particular to adapt the format of the Conference to the restrictions, orders, and prohibitions related to the introduction of a state of pandemic or a state of epidemic threat, as well as to increase the safety measures accompanying the Conference. The amendment to the Regulations will come into force within 7 days of its publication on the Conference Website. For Participants who have accepted the Regulations before the amendment, the amendment will come into force within 7 days of informing them of the amendment to the Regulations by electronic mail and the lack of objection to this amendment within the aforementioned time limit.
6. The Organizer reserves the right to amend the Regulations also in the case of a change to the Regulations that does not adversely affect the rights of Participants, or in the case of a change consisting of correcting obvious typographical errors and editorial mistakes. In such a case, the amendment to the Regulations may come into force in a shorter period than 7 days, but not shorter than 3 days, after informing the Participants of the amendment to the Regulations by electronic mail and the lack of objection to this amendment within the aforementioned time limit.
7. The Organizer reserves the right to change the date and format of the Conference in a situation where its conduct in the date and format specified in paragraph 1 above will be impossible or excessively difficult due to reasons beyond the Organizer's control, in particular due to restrictions, orders, and prohibitions related to the introduction of a state of pandemic or a state of epidemic threat. The change of the date and/or format of the Conference will be immediately announced on the Conference Website.
8. The Organizer reserves the right to introduce changes to the program of the Conference, about which it will inform immediately on the Conference Website.

§ 2

Registration for the Conference

1. Participation in the Conference is subject to payment and requires prior registration through a registration form (hereinafter referred to as the "Form"), available on the Conference Website, in which the person wishing to participate in the Conference will be required to provide the following information: first and last name, email address, affiliation.
2. The detailed procedure for registering for the Conference, registration deadlines, and the amount of the Registration Fee (hereinafter referred to as the "Fee"), as well as the method and deadline for payment, have been provided on the Conference Website.
3. In case of cancellation of participation in the Conference, the Participant is obliged to inform the Organizer by 31 July 2023 by sending relevant information to the email address: timecrystals@uj.edu.pl. A Participant who cancels their participation in the Conference by 31.07.2023 and informs the Organizer by sending a message to the email address timecrystals@uj.edu.pl, in the manner specified in this paragraph, will be refunded the Fee paid by the Participant (bank fees are not refundable). Cancellation of participation in the Conference after 31.07.2023 will result in no refund of the Fee paid by the Participant. Refunds of Fees will be made by the Organizer after the end of the Conference.
4. The Organizer is not responsible for any incorrect or false information provided by the Participant during the registration of participation in the Conference.
5. The Conference can accommodate a maximum of 120 Participants. Each Conference Participant has the right to attend the conference banquet, which will take place at the place and time indicated by the Organizer on the Conference Website (hereinafter referred to as the "Banquet").
6. The Scientific Committee decides on the acceptance of the participation application in the Conference based on the following criteria: the scientific level of the submitted abstracts and, where possible, ensuring representation by Participants from different scientific centers around the world. A person interested in participating in the Conference who has registered in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 8 below and has submitted an abstract will receive an email message from the Organizer informing them of their qualification or non-qualification for participation in the Conference by no later than June 20, 2023. The Scientific Committee's decision on the qualification of a person as a Conference Participant is final and cannot be appealed.
7. The participant limits mentioned in paragraph 5 above may change due to the epidemiological situation prevailing during the Conference and the related restrictions, orders, and bans. The Organizer will immediately notify any changes in the limits on the Conference Website. If it is necessary to limit the number of Conference Participants, the Organizer, with the assistance of the Scientific Committee, will re-qualify Participants based on the criteria mentioned in paragraph 6 above, within the available limits. The Organizer will inform Participants who, due to the change in limits, will not be able to participate in the Conference and will refund the Fee paid by them. The decision of the Organizing Committee is final.
8. The provisions of the Regulations become binding upon registration of participation in the Conference. By registering for the Conference, the interested party confirms familiarity with the Regulations and acceptance of its provisions, which is equivalent to granting the permissions, licenses, and authorizations referred to in the Regulations. Registration for

participation in the Conference is completed at the moment when the Participant's data is completed in the content of the Form and sent along with the consents referred to in § 5-8 of the Regulations, using the registration system, the link to which is located on the Conference Website.

9. According to clause 8, once registered, a person acquires the status of Participant after receiving confirmation from the Organizer that they have been qualified to participate in the Conference, and upon payment of the Fee. Failure to pay the Fee by the registered person selected by the Scientific Committee to participate in the Conference, by July 31, 2023, is equivalent to not obtaining the status of Conference participant and the inability to participate in the Conference. The payment deadline is the date when the Fee is credited to the Organizer's bank account.

§ 3

General rules of participation in the Conference

1. During the Conference, lectures by guests invited by the Organizer and lectures and posters by presenters selected by the Organizer from the Conference Participants who expressed such a desire will be presented. The Conference will be conducted in English. Detailed information and the exact Conference program are available on the Conference website.
2. The course of the Conference will be recorded in the form of a photo report (hereinafter referred to as the "Photo Report"). The Organizer will make the Photo Report from the Conference available indefinitely to an unlimited audience on the Conference website, on the Organizer's social media profiles and channels, and on university social media channels (especially Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram).
3. The Conference Organizer, by providing Conference materials to Participants (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference Materials"), pays special attention to the need to respect intellectual property rights. Participants undertake to use the Conference Materials provided to them by the Organizer only for their own personal use. Modifying, copying, transmitting, publicly reproducing, and any use of these Conference Materials for commercial purposes requires prior written consent from the Organizer or another authorized entity. Participants are fully responsible for any damages resulting from their behavior contrary to the above reservation.
4. Participants accept the established rules of the Conference and its program and undertake not to influence its change and not to disrupt the course of the Conference.

§ 4

Rights and obligations of on-site participants

1. On-site participants are obliged to comply with safety rules, occupational health and safety regulations, fire safety regulations, and the sanitary regime regulations in force during the Conference and Banquet in the venues where they are held.
2. The Organizer is not responsible for items left behind or lost during the Conference and Banquet, as well as for items left in clothing, backpacks/bags/suitcases, and other public areas at the Conference, Jagiellonian University, and the venue of the Banquet.
3. The Organizer is not responsible for incidents resulting from participants' non-compliance with the Regulations, failure to follow the Organizer's recommendations, and instructions of the Conference staff and responsible security and order services.

§ 5

Lectures

1. When registering for the Conference via the Form, the registrant may inform the Organizer of their desire to deliver a lecture (hereinafter referred to as the "Lecture") or present a poster (hereinafter referred to as the "Poster"). Registrations are accepted until May 31, 2023.
2. The person who expressed their desire to deliver a Lecture or present a Poster shall send the Organizer an author's abstract of the Lecture or Poster they intend to present during the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the "Abstract"), in the form of a digital text file via the Form no later than May 31, 2023. By June 20, 2023, the Scientific Committee will select speakers who will present Lectures and Posters (hereinafter referred to as the "Speakers") based on the submitted Abstracts, and will immediately inform those whose Abstracts have been selected by sending them a feedback email no later than June 20, 2023. Further contact aimed at arranging the details of the Speaker's appearance will take place in a manner agreed upon by the Speaker and the Organizer.
3. When making the decisions referred to in point 2 above, the Scientific Committee is guided by the need to ensure a high scientific level and thematic diversity of the Conference. The Scientific Committee's decision is final and does not require justification, and Participants have no right to appeal it.
4. Participants who are Speakers invited by the Organizer to participate in the Conference shall send the Organizer an author's abstract of the Lecture they intend to present during the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the "Abstract") in the form of a digital text file no later than July 31, 2023, via email to the address provided.
5. Taking the actions referred to in paragraphs 1-4 above is an expression of the Participant granting the Organizer a non-exclusive, unlimited, territorial, quantitative and qualitative license to use the Abstract, to the extent and in fields of exploitation analogous to those referred to in § 6 paragraphs 5-8 of the Regulations and in fields of exploitation indicated in Article 50 of the Copyright and Related Rights Act, with the right to grant sublicenses to third parties to the extent analogous to the scope of the license, for the purpose of deciding on the Participant's qualification as a Speaker, preparing, organizing, conducting and settling the Conference, preparing conference materials, including the abstract book made available on the Conference website. The provisions of § 6 paragraphs 1-3 and 9 of the Regulations apply accordingly to the Abstract.
6. Delivering a Lecture, presenting a Poster, and granting the Organizer permissions, authorizations and licenses referred to in § 5-7 of the Regulations, to use the Abstract, Lecture, Poster, and Speaker's image, to the extent and on all fields of exploitation indicated there, is free of charge and takes place for the statutory purposes of the Organizer, subject to separate agreements concluded with the Speaker.
7. Granting permissions, licenses, and authorizations to the Organizer, as referred to in § 5-7 of the Regulations, is voluntary but necessary to present the Lecture and/or Poster.

§ 6

Copyright

1. The Speaker bears full responsibility for the form and content of the Lecture/Poster.
2. The Speaker undertakes to develop and present an original Lecture/Poster and guarantees that the Lecture/Poster will not violate the rights and personal interests of third parties or contain views advocating hatred or discrimination against any persons based on racial, cultural, ethnic, religious, ideological, or gender grounds.
3. If any part of the Lecture/Poster consists of legally protected elements to which the Speaker does not have the rights, the Speaker guarantees that they are authorized to use them to the extent necessary to deliver the Lecture/presentation of the Poster and to grant the Organizer a license with the right to sublicense, as referred to in this paragraph, without the need for the Organizer to obtain additional consents and permissions.
4. Upon commencing the delivery of the Lecture, the Speaker grants the Organizer a non-exclusive, territorially unrestricted license to use the Lecture for educational purposes, advertising, and promotion of the Organizer and the Conference itself, including the public presentation of the Lecture's content at the Conference venue and time.
5. Upon commencing the presentation of the Poster, the Speaker grants the Organizer a non-exclusive, temporally and territorially unrestricted, quantitatively and qualitatively unlimited license, with the right to sublicense to the same extent as the license, to use the Poster and the image of the Poster fixed in the Photo Report - in whole or in part, independently, as well as in the context of a collective work, in combination with works and elements freely chosen by the Organizer (including Posters of other Speakers, including in the so-called conference materials, Photo Report), as well as with its adaptations, adaptations, and all materials, graphics, fragments, shots, and documentation created during the creation of the Photo Report and after its fixation - for informational, documentary, educational, didactic, advertising, and promotional purposes of the Organizer and the Conference itself, including in particular the use and provision on the Internet, Intranet, as well as within any telecommunications services using any systems and devices, on all social media profiles and services of the Organizer, on the Organizer's website and other websites and on the Conference's website, as well as on university social media channels (especially Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram).
6. The license referred to in paragraph 5 above (hereinafter referred to as the "License") covers the use of the Poster in the following fields of exploitation:
 - a) public display of the Poster during poster sessions at the Conference venue and time;
 - b) fixation and reproduction of the Poster - fixation of the image of the Poster in the Photoreport and reproduction of it using all available techniques, including printing, reprographic, magnetic recording, and digital techniques (e.g. DVD, magneto-optical media);
 - c) permanent or temporary reproduction of the image of the Poster fixed in the Photoreport in whole or in part by any means and in any form;

d) in the scope of disseminating the image of the Poster fixed in the Photoreport - public sharing of the image of the Poster in such a way that anyone can access it in a place and time of their choosing, using all available techniques, including using the Internet, Intranet, and other computer networks, posting and modifying the image of the Poster fixed in the Photoreport on the Organizer's websites, in social media services, on the Conference website, in the Organizer's social media profiles and channels, in particular Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram, broadcasting the image of the Poster using multimedia and telecommunications networks, modifying the image of the Poster fixed in the Photoreport to enable navigation on web pages, and public sharing at publicly available exhibitions or displays;

e) in the scope of trading in the original or copies on which the image of the Poster was fixed - introducing the original or copies into circulation, lending, or renting them;

f) creating and disseminating derivative works based on the image of the Poster fixed in the Photoreport, including further projects/materials based on it or its individual elements, including developing different graphic versions, color schemes, or visual or spatial formats, and using such derivative works in the scope and on all fields of exploitation defined in this paragraph;

g) disseminating in the press, on the Internet;

h) modifying the image of the Poster fixed in the Photoreport in whole or in part and making modifications to it, including the right to correct, make modifications and changes to the whole or its individual elements.

7. The license also includes the right for the Organizer and persons acting on their behalf with related rights to the image of the Poster fixed in the Photo Report, in all fields of exploitation as mentioned in point 6 above, and the right to authorize third parties to exercise related copyright rights to the image of the Poster to the extent used by the Organizer.

8. The Speaker undertakes not to exercise his personal author's rights to the Lecture/Poster against the Organizer and its authorized entities, and in particular the right to the integrity of the content and form of the Lecture/Poster and its fair use, the decision on the first public presentation of the Lecture/Poster, supervision of the way the Lecture/Poster is used, and the decision on the manner of indicating the author of the Lecture/Poster, with the reservation that the Organizer is obliged to respect the Speaker's request as to the indication of the person presenting the Lecture/Poster, if possible.

9. In the event of claims by third parties against the Organizer and/or entities acting on its behalf and/or entities authorized by it to use the Lecture and/or Poster/Abstract (hereinafter referred to as "Authorized Entities") relating to the Lecture and/or Poster/Abstract, their images, or their individual elements, the Speaker:

a) shall release the Organizer and/or Authorized Entities from such claims to the extent to which he was obliged to acquire from third parties the rights to legally protected elements of the Lecture and/or Poster/Abstract, including property rights and related rights to them and their individual elements, and to obtain their permits and authorizations as mentioned in this paragraph, and

b) shall be fully responsible for any damages incurred by the Organizer and/or Authorized Entities due to claims as referred to in point a) above, including but not limited to damages related to claims

for compensation for unlawful use of the Lecture and/or Poster, Abstract or their individual elements.

§ 7

Image

1. The Organizer will record the course of the Conference using devices that capture images in the form of a photo report (hereinafter referred to as "Photo Report") for informational, documentary, educational, didactic, advertising, and promotional purposes of the Organizer and the Conference itself.
2. By declaring their intention to participate in the Conference in the Registration Form, the Participant/Speaker expresses an unlimited, temporally, territorially, quantitatively, and qualitatively unrestricted consent to the use of their image for the purposes indicated in point 1 above, without the right to remuneration for this, in particular by recording the image of the Participant/Speaker in the Photo Report and using this recording, processing, duplicating and multiple dissemination of the image of the Participant/Speaker recorded in the aforementioned way without the need for their approval on each occasion, in particular to the extent and in a manner analogous to that referred to in § 6 para. 5-7 of the Regulations, including on the Conference Website, on the Organizer's Websites, and on other websites, on social media services and profiles of the Organizer in social media and on websites, at promotional events of the Organizer, on university channels in social media (in particular Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram).
3. The Participant/Speaker is aware that the Photo Report from the Conference will be made available on the Internet and will be available on the Conference Website, on the Organizer's websites, in social media services and profiles of the organizer, and on university channels in social media (in particular Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram), for an unlimited number of persons without time limitations.
4. In connection with the use of the image of the Participant/Speaker, they will not exercise the right to control and approve the use of the image, including the right to approve the final form of the Photo Report in which they were used and the right to indicate on each occasion that they are a person shown in the Photo Report, and in particular to indicate their name and surname.
5. The Conference may only be photographed in the form of a Photo Report by the Organizer.
6. The Organizer has the right to authorize other entities to use the image on the terms specified in this regulations.

§ 8

Processing of personal data

According to Article 13 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter "GDPR"), Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. The Administrator of the Participant's personal data is Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the Rector of the University.

2. Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Officer, ul. Czapskich 4, 31-110 Kraków. Contact with the Inspector is possible by e-mail: iod@uj.edu.pl or by phone: +48 12 663 12 25 - from Monday to Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

3. The Participant's personal data will be processed for the purpose of:

a) executing the contract, which is the participation in the Time Crystals Conference, as well as registering participation in the Conference, accepting applications from Participants willing to deliver a Lecture/Poster presentation, i.e. based on art. 6(1)(b) of the GDPR, on the basis of the contract concluded through acceptance of the Regulations. The Conference will be held in a stationary form from 6 to 8 September 2023 by Jagiellonian University;

b) in relation to personal data in the form of an image, processed in the implementation of the Organiser's legitimate interest - i.e. for promotional, informational, documentary and archival purposes, based on art. 6(1)(f) of the GDPR and in accordance with § 7 of the Regulations.

4. Providing personal data by the Participant:

a) in relation to the data referred to in point 3(a) above is necessary to conclude the contract, participate in the Conference, develop an Abstract and deliver a Lecture/Poster presentation; b) in relation to the data referred to in point 3(b) above is voluntary.

5. Recipients of the Participant's personal data are entities providing IT and organisational support in the organisation of the Conference - including the entity providing software for registration for the Conference. The Participant's personal data may be made available to entities authorised to receive them on the basis of generally applicable laws.

6. The Participant's personal data will not be transferred to third countries (outside the European Economic Area) or to international organisations.

7. The Participant's personal data will be stored for the duration of the Conference organisation and until the final settlement and closing of the Conference, as well as until the limitation period for claims arising from the performance of the contract referred to in point 3(a) above, and in the scope indicated in point 3(b) above - until an objection is raised to the processing of data.

8. The Participant's personal data provided in the Registration Form will not be made available to third parties.

9. The personal data of the Participant in the form of their image may be recorded in photos from the Conference used to create a Photo Report and processed on the Conference website, on the time-crystals.org website, on the Organizer's social media services and profiles (especially Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram), in a way that allows access by third parties, for informational, documentary, educational, teaching, advertising, and promotional purposes of the Organizer and the Conference itself, as well as archiving, including for the purpose of reporting on the Conference - in accordance with § 7 of the Regulations.

10. In the case of a Participant who has expressed a desire to give a Lecture/Presentation of a Poster, their personal data, voluntarily provided in the content of the Lecture/Poster, will be processed on the Conference website and for informational and documentary purposes.

11. The Participant has the right to: obtain information about the processing of their personal data and their rights according to the GDPR, access the content of their data and correct it, as well as the right to delete their personal data from the administrator's database (unless further processing is necessary to perform a legal obligation or for the purpose of establishing, pursuing or defending claims), and the right to limit processing, data transfer, and to object to processing - in cases and on terms specified in the GDPR.

12. The Participant's personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making or profiling.
13. The Participant has the right to file a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if they believe that the processing of their personal data violates the GDPR regulations.

§ 9

Final provisions

1. These Regulations are made available to Conference Participants on the Conference Website and enter into force on the day of their publication on the website time-crystals.org.
2. In case of cancellation of the Conference, the Organizer will immediately inform on the Conference website. The Organizer will not be obliged to compensate or indemnify Participants or Speakers for any costs incurred in connection with participation in the Event, except for a refund of the Fee.
3. The applicable law is Polish law. In matters not regulated by the Regulations, the generally applicable provisions of Polish law shall apply.
4. All disputes shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Polish common courts of general jurisdiction.
5. These Regulations have been prepared in Polish and English versions, and in case of any discrepancies between these versions, the Polish version shall prevail.
